**OUR REVIEW:** Text has more of a 'story' feel than original so should engage younger readers effectively. A useful, accessible abridgement, ideal for KS2.

What was Anne Frank's sister called?

In 1940 life for Jewish people changed. How and why?

What year did the Frank family leave Germany? Where did they go?

How old was Anne when she had her diary for her birthday?

When did the Frank family go into hiding? Why?
